
## **AND THE WINNER IS!!!**

## **ANNUAL REPORT 2008**

### **36TH ANNUAL PARTY AND MEETING** SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 2008

he Annual Meeting on September 29, 2007, at the home of Kate and Kirk Saunders, was Lattended by some 80 residents, followed by a very successful party with dinner and refreshments organized by Rhonda Kinn with Doug Kinn, Fran Chilcote and many others. Approximately 140 persons attended this event.

An organizational steering committee meeting was held April 3, 2008, at the home of Charlotte Masarik. Reports presented included membership and update of residents in the six neighborhood groups (Fran); budget presentation and approval (Elaine Merz); and organization of the annual meeting (Ron ) and party (Rhonda).

Other on-going projects include Joe Baker's and Doug Kinn's emergency plan for evacuation; Dave Walker's project on speed humps (not bumps) on side streets, and lowering the posted speed limit to 15 miles per hour; and Chris Reed's efforts to eradicate invasive plants in Park and Rimrock Canyons. Three newsletters have appeared: Fall 2007; Winter 2008; and Spring-Summer 2008. A newsletter (Fall 2008) will appear in late October.

A major effort against the Thurston (Pike) subdivision involved the extensive participation of residents on Thurston Drive, San Remo Drive, Donna Drive and Temple Hills Drive. THCA was supported by neighborhood associations from North Laguna, South Laguna, Top of the World, Mystic Hills and elsewhere. The variance for the project was rejected by the Planning Commission (5-0) and the City Council (4-0).

The association continues its efforts to conserve privately owned open space in Park and Rimrock Canyons.

The association has joined with a community of concerned Laguna citizens to deal in unison with important issues that would be coming before the City. The four most pressing issues have involved 1) height limit in commercial zone, 2) Aliso Creek and Montage project, 3) inner greenbelt, and 4) large assisted-living structure behind hospital. Our representation includes Bob Borthwick, Ron Chilcote, Charlotte Masarik and Verna Rollinger.

A candidates' forum, cosponsored with Top of the World, will be held at City Hall on Monday, October 20, at 7 p.m. We invite input about questions, especially relevant to Temple Hills, to ask the candidates. — The Steering Committee, September 20, 2008 ₽
